





In the realm of psychology, we often focus on trauma, stress, and what breaks the human spirit. But what about what heals it? Kindness — especially the random, unasked-for kind — is not just a moral virtue; it's a powerful psychological tool.

Neuroscience shows that acts of kindness, whether given or received, release feel-good neurotransmitters like dopamine, serotonin, and oxytocin—the very chemicals responsible for boosting mood, lowering stress, and deepening connection.

I recall a moment when a stranger paid for my coffee after I stood fumbling for my missing wallet. The gesture cost

him barely anything, but for me — on a chaotic, emotionally heavy day — it was grounding. I felt seen. In that moment, my brain registered safety, not threat.

Another time, I encouraged my househelp's daughter to pursue reading by gifting her a few old storybooks and stationery. Today, she's thriving academically. What I did for her was

small, but it rewired something in both of us — for her, a belief in possibilities; for me, the joy of meaningful contribution.

Research calls this the helper's high—when doing good for others enhances our own mental well-being. Witnessing kindness also activates mirror neurons, encouraging empathy and emotional resonance. A young man helping an elderly woman across the street may seem mundane, but to onlookers, it stirs a subtle shift toward trust in humanity.

In a world often dominated by negativity, random acts of kindness are micro-moments of healing. They foster connection, enhance resilience, and create positive emotional memory traces. So, the next time you're kind — without agenda or applause — know this: you're not just helping someone. You're rewiring brains, softening hearts, and quietly reshaping the human experience.



Ride to Unity



An Exhilarating Motorcycle Odyssey Through Nepal's Mustang Region

or eight days, I embarked on an unforgettable 2,200 km motorcycle expedition through Nepal's stunning Mustang region under the theme "Ride to Unity" — a collaborative initiative by 41ers Riders Club of Round Table India. This cross-border adventure began in Siliguri, India, where I met my six fellow Tabling bikers — strangers at the start, but brothers by the end.

We rode Royal Enfield Himalayan 450cc bikes (mine, a rented one with just under 9,000 km on the odometer). Each rider came from a different part of India, running businesses in textiles, electricals, silks, insulation, and more. That's the beauty of such rides — discovering new terrains and people while rediscovering yourself.



The ride was tough. Over 60% of Nepal's mountain roads were under construction or barely motorable, riddled with loose gravel, landslides, and sharp curves winding through valleys and gorges. It reminded me of my earlier rides through Kashmir and Ladakh — raw, risky, and rewarding.

We rode 7–8 hours a day, often reflecting in solitude within our helmets, racing against wind and gravity with the Himalayas watching silently. Day one tested our patience with unnecessary delays at the border despite having pre-approved permits. Lesson learned: ensure your travel agent is experienced when crossing borders by land.

Once past the Siliguri-Itahari checkpoint, our ride began in earnest. We were warmly welcomed by Nepal Round Table members at various towns — Khakharbitta, Itahari, Bharatpur, and Bardibas. Despite the scorching heat and dusty detours, their hospitality and shared Tabling spirit recharged us.

The Itahari–Bardibas stretch was particularly punishing — under construction, dusty, and slippery with water-sprayed mud. I rode through choking dust clouds, battling road fatigue and minor altitude effects. One of our teammates even had to discontinue and ride in the support vehicle. A backup car, mechanic, and first aid kit proved invaluable.







As night fell, we reached Bardibas after a long and tense ride through forests. Local truck drivers in Nepal were surprisingly cooperative, unlike their Indian counterparts. Stray animals were minimal, and even the few roadkill incidents were respectfully covered — a stark contrast to Indian highways.

We passed through picturesque villages with stilted wooden homes, livestock below, and fruit trees and vegetable gardens around. Life here moved at a peaceful, unhurried pace. Schoolchildren walked long distances, villagers carried heavy loads in baskets, and everyone wore bright smiles that lit up their sun-kissed faces.

At Pokhara, the "Lake City," we stayed at the scenic Barahi Resort overlooking the snow-capped Annapurna range. After a day's rest, we rode to Jomsom, battling the worst roads near Beni and arriving well into freezing darkness. Om's Home, a charming heritage lodge, welcomed us with warm rooms and electric blankets as temperatures dropped to -3°C.

Altitude sickness hit one of our riders, highlighting the importance of our safety-first planning. The next morning's ride to Mukthinath was magical — a smooth road at 12,500 ft flanked by majestic peaks and dazzling blue skies. The 300-step climb to the temple tested our lungs, but the sight of hundreds of Indian pilgrims — some on horseback or dolis—was heartwarming.

The return ride followed the same route back to Siliguri, but we allowed ourselves a day to recover in Pokhara with massages and spa therapy — much needed after the intense journey.

In retrospect, this ride was more than a physical feat. It tested and built our focus, patience, confidence, and friendships. We bonded over breakdowns, border waits, roadside teas, laughter, dust, cold winds, and shared awe at Nepal's natural beauty.

What made it truly special was the Tabling fellowship — where strangers from different states became trusted companions, united by the open road and a common cause. That's the magic of Round Table: you're never alone, just meeting friends you hadn't met yet.

This ride was exhausting, humbling, and exhilarating. And I'd do it all over again — just for the thrill of the ride, the warmth of fellowship, and the call of the mountains.


Where Faith meets Fellowship
