80G certification received for Association of 41 Clubs of India. We have applied for MCA registration to enable us to raise corporate CSR


funds. We have started receiving funds. I urge you start contributing to our 80G body Association of 41 Clubs of India, enable us execute projects while taking tax benefits as eligible

Convenor Extension 41er Satya with Anita and myself.



My dear Friends in our 41 family,


Greetings.

I am grateful to all 41ers and their families for giving me an opportunity to serve them along with members of the NEX for the year 2022-23. I am indebted to each and every member of the NEX for being by my side in our quest of FRIENDS FOR LIFE. I will always cherish the fond memories of the year gone by.

Let's go down memory lane.



Fellowship continues to be our basis. It was a Blessing for Jyoti and me to travel the length and breadth of the country to be with you all. We will never forget the love, affection and hospitality that we received from all of you. God Bless you all.

We were able to cover more than 1.10 lakh kilometers in more than 180 days to be with you all.

Howzaat Inter Area Cricket Tournament held at Bhubaneswar in November 2022 was a runaway success and a toast of the country.

We had 8 wonderful Mid Term Meets in the 8 Areas, one better than the other culminating in a wonderful time at Guwahati.

Two FAMITS were held along with the MTMs of Area 1 and 6.

Many signature events were held in many centers. There were 6 meaningful Board meetings (including one online) during the year.

YAPS – Young Ambassadors Programme continues to be our Flagship project. We had two inbound teams which covered North and South India and the YAP members got an insight of our country, its beauty, culture, heritage, history, had a wonderful time and went back to their country thoroughly enriched.

The involvement of all to make the YAPS inbound programmes a runaway success is noteworthy.

There were 5 outbound trips - Europe North, Europe South, Europe Central, GB and I and South Africa, where the children visited and have come back richer in knowledge and experience and above all had a rollicking time.

YAPS seats for outbound trips have gone up to 32 and the YAPS fees have been raised to 630 Euros per participant.

Freedom Through Digital Education – (FTDe) has taken off and funds for 40 projects have been raised and executed with support from P L

Mohanty of Managovind Charitable Trust as well as Narendra Mehta Trust (through BRT – 2 Trust). All were supplied by our approved vendor Moinee Foundation and the impact on the children has been tremendous. All projects have been executed jointly by 41 Clubs with Round Table, LC India and Tangent India in keeping with our Aims and Objects and our goal of 4 Associations – One family.

Funds were raised in spite of the fact that 80 G exemption was not available.

103 Star Medallions have been sold resulting in collection of Rs. 5.15 Lakhs which have used for FTDe projects.

Share Your Joy (SYJ) Projects are becoming increasing popular. This year we have been able to give Matching grant of Rs. 50000/- each to about 24 projects.

41 India has Project Crimson which creates awareness on Menstrual Hygiene and distribution of biodegradable sanitary napkins, This is a 41 Clubs project which is being executed through Tangent India.

Focus was given to Extension. 14 New Clubs have been chartered and 240 New members have been added. We now have 261 active clubs.

104 members have been added from 01.07.2023 to 31 08.2023.

Nagpur has again become a 41 center. 14 charter members joined Club 145 at an impressive ceremony.

Area 7 saw the highest number of charters during the year – 4 along with the highet number of members added in the year – 41.

The highest number of members inducted into a club other than charter is 11 and the honours go to Club 217 Kolkata.

The highest number of charters at a single center goes to Hyderabad with 3 charters.

Total number of members stands at 3632 as on 31st August 2023. We mourn the passing away

of 14 members who have left for their Heavenly Abode in 2022-23.

An Extension Manual is available on the website.

Financial systems have been put in place. The Treasurer's report is very comprehensive, exhaustive and clear, which is bound to make the task of future Treasurer's easy.

All IT returns have been filed and the icing on the cake is that we have received the 80 G Exemption certificate which will open the floodgates for CSR funds and projects.

After discussions, the Mutual Funds were redeemed and put in FDs resulting in higher interest. The expiring FDs have also been shifted to earn higher rates of interest.

More funds will therefore be available in the Society accounts so that more projects can be undertaken.

The corpus in our Society account stands at more than 3 crores.

A lot of work has gone into the revamping of the website which is now very user friendly with a host of useful features. We were facing hurdles trying to incorporate additions/ improvements to the website. After examining many written offers, we zeroed in on a vendor headed by Avidant Bhagat, son of 41er Samir Bhagat of Hyderabad who had developed the website for Tangent India. The result is there to see. More than 1500 members have registered for using the website, which is a wonderful achievement. The website has links to the sites of 41 International, Round Table India, LC India and Tangent India.

Features on the website like Birthdays and Anniversaries are very popular. One can open a Whatsapp chat from the website; one can import contacts as well as talk to a mobile number.

An automated message in the name of the Secretary goes out at 5 am to members and their spouses, on behalf of the NEX wishing members and their spouses on their birthdays and anniversariesGreetings on Birthdays and

Anniversaries have been received very well by the members and their spouse, as their responses show.

All the above are available on the mobile phones with the click of an icon.

Payment and submission of Form A and B have been simplified and a Payment Gateway is available and functioning. Payment Gateway facilities will soon be available for Supply House items.

AAF payments and submission of A and B Forms were done in record time.

YAPS application has gone online and soon other forms like New Charter application, New member application will go online.

41 BNB had been introduced whereby members can avail resorts, home stays etc belonging to 41ers.

An Insurance Desk was in place which has been of immense help to the members especially for claim settlement—the settle record being 100%,

Golf tournament was also being organized on 14th September 2023 at the RCGC Kolkata and was a big success

Registrations were to the tune of 390 with a lot of participation in pre and post tours.

It was very heartening to note that more and more members are now coming forward to take up responsibilities in our organization.

Our functioning of The Secretariat at Chennai has been streamlined and is manned by competent staff. Supply House continues to be profitable.

41 India members are registered with 41er world. Subscription of 41 International has been made on time.

The performance of the NEX members - Head Board, Area Chairman, Convenors, Special invitees and Permanent invitees has been exemplary. A lot of hard work has been put in. Bonding and camaraderie was of a very high order.







understand the challenges others face.


